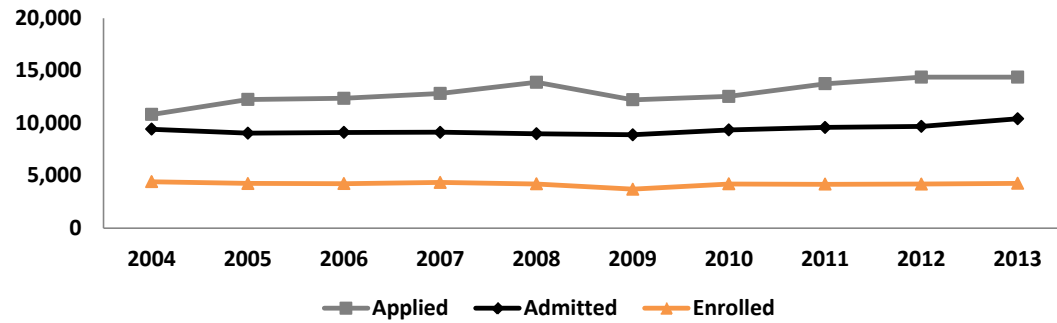

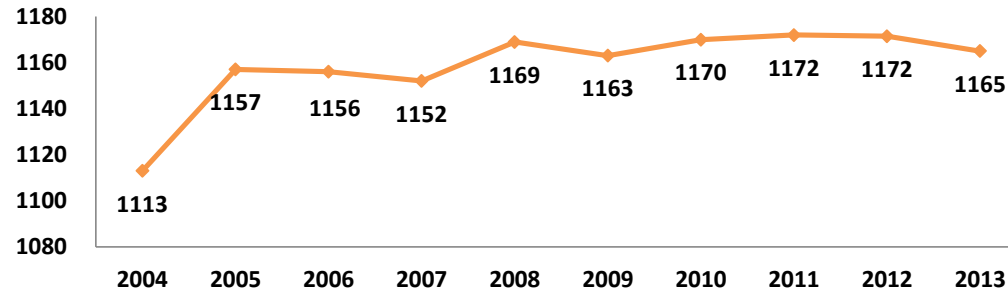

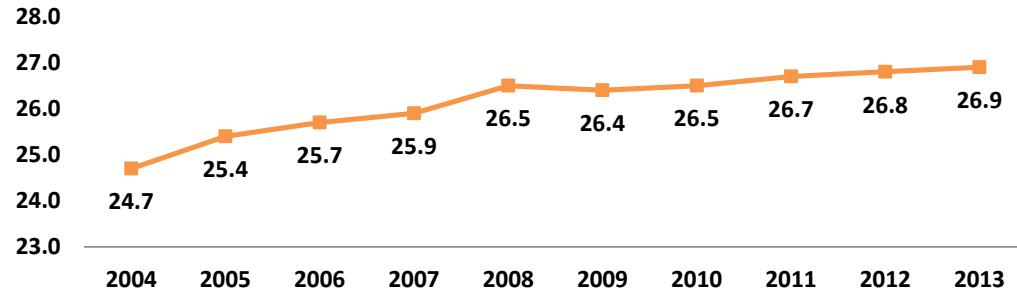
**10 Year Trend of First-Time Freshman

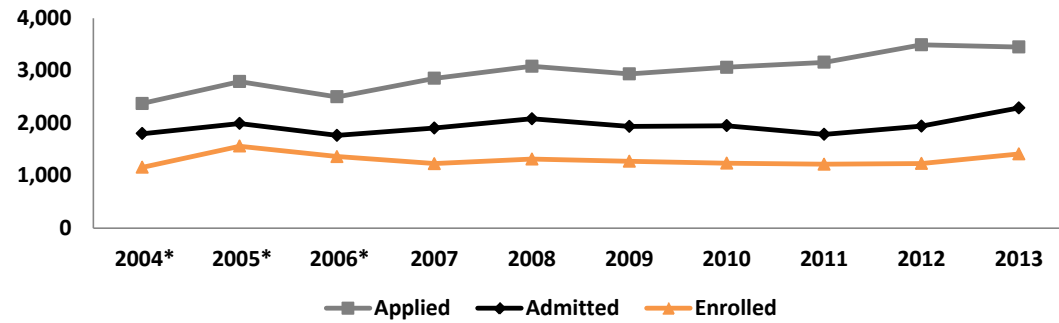

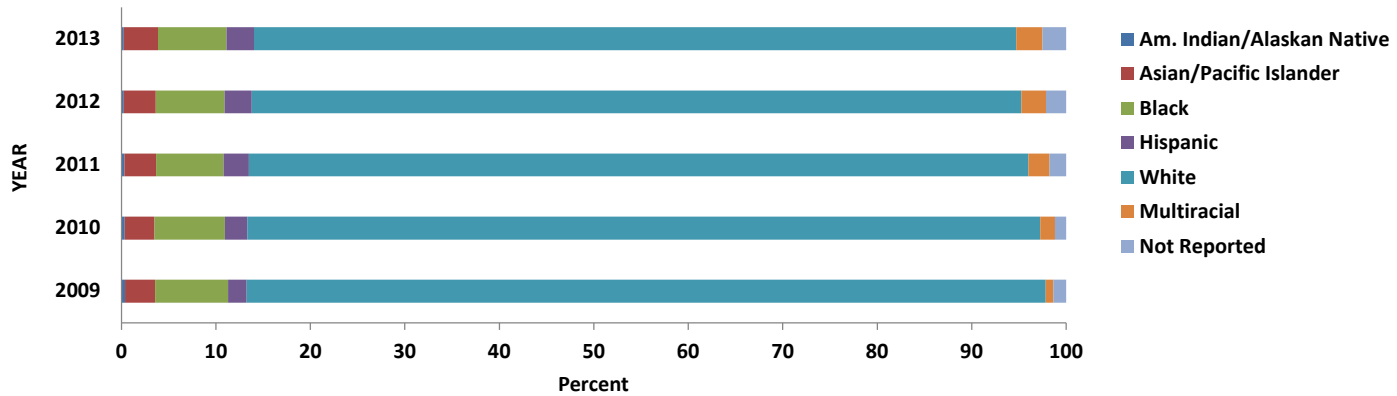

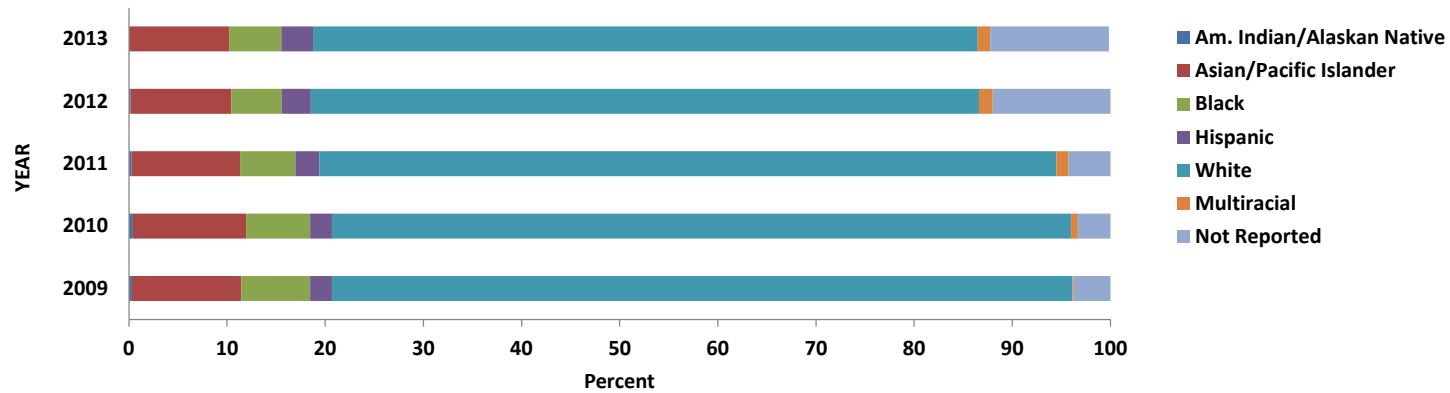

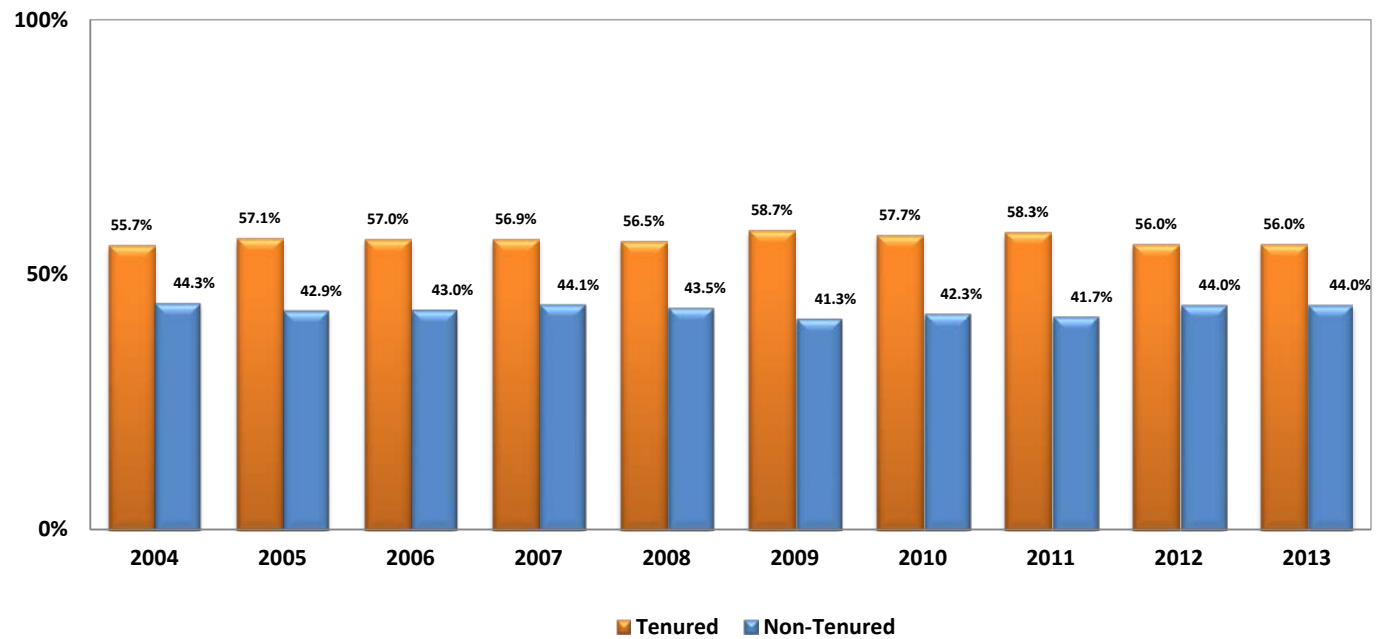

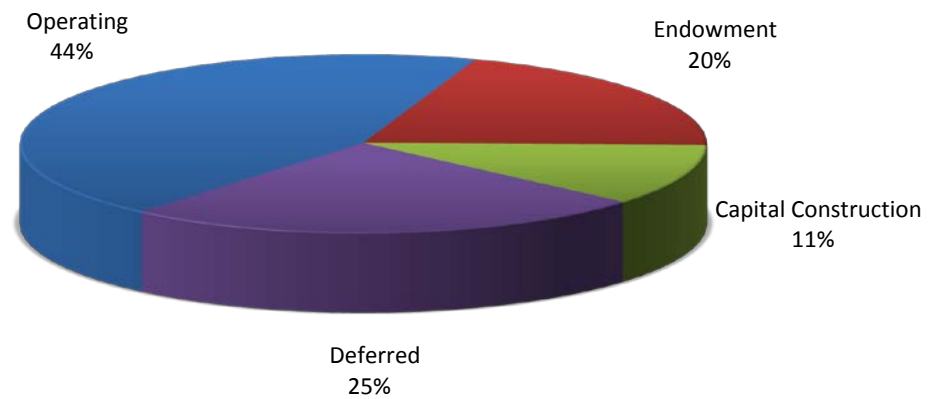


UT Knoxville Analysis by Purpose

July 1, 2012 - June 30, 2013

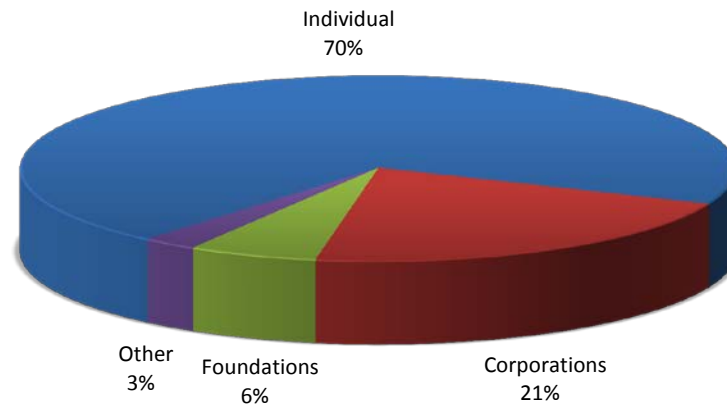

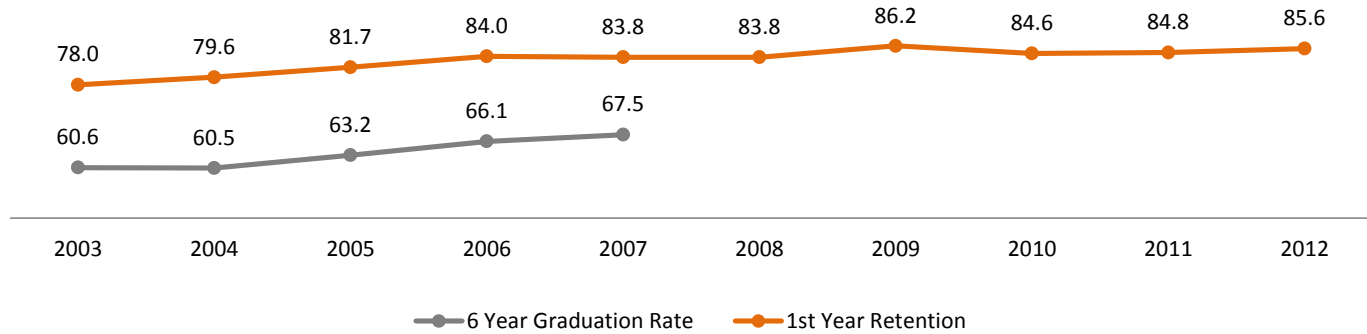

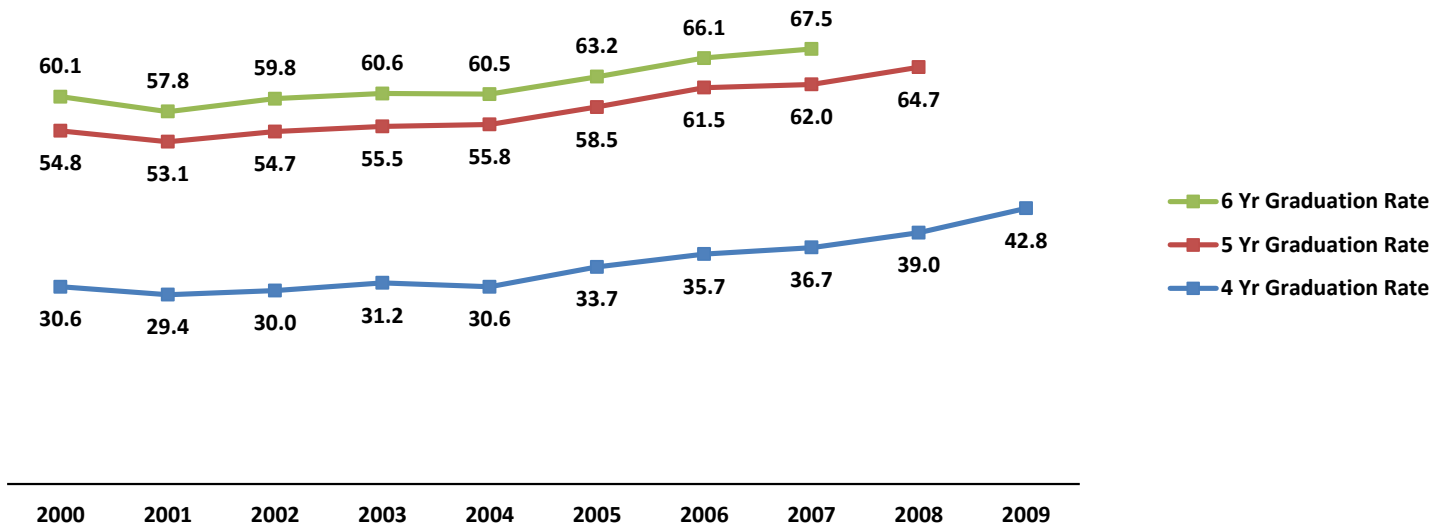
10 Year Trend of Retention and Graduation Rates First-time Full-time Freshman Fall Cohorts 2003-2012

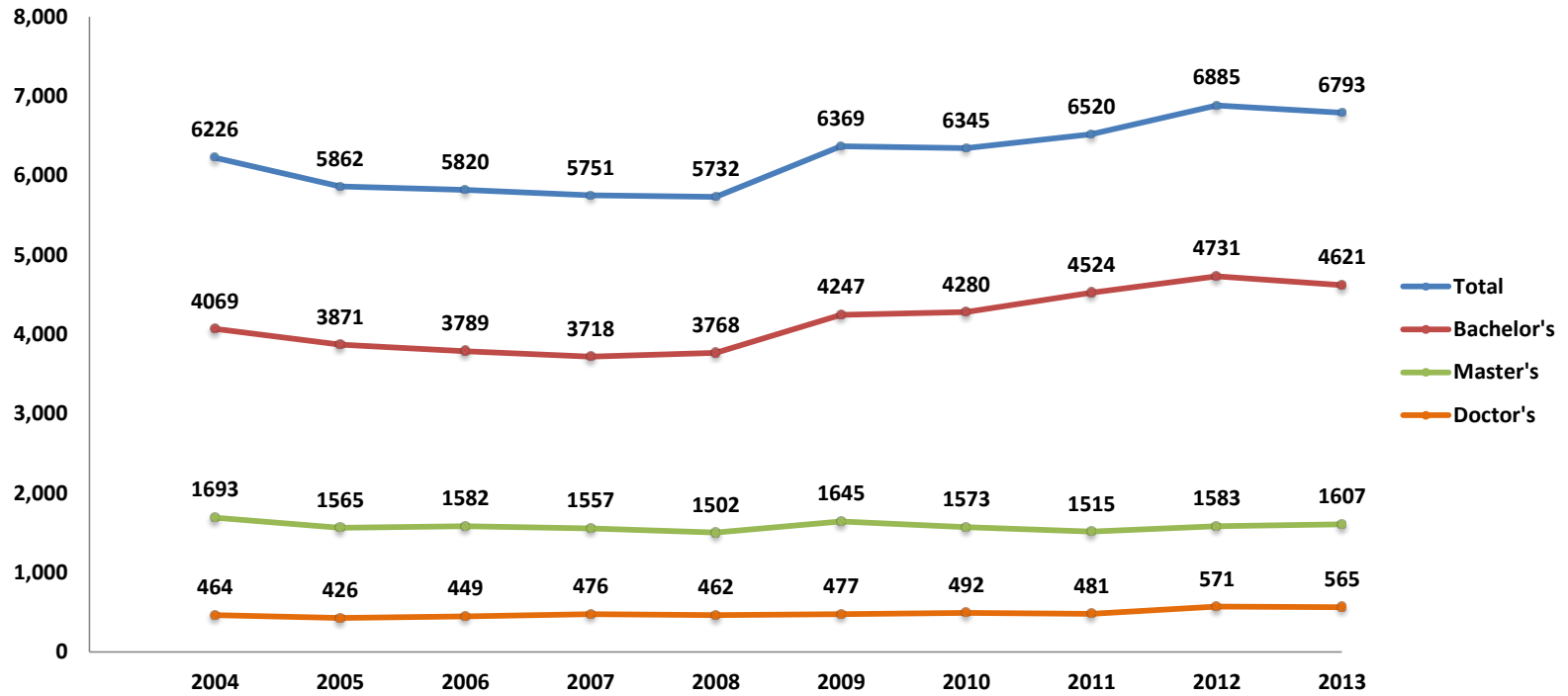
