Rankings are based on the following criteria: such as outcomes, peer assessments, faculty and financial resources, student excellence, and faculty research. Rankings serve a purpose, but only measure a small portion of what we use as an institution to measure our success.

This report presents the 2024 U.S. News Best Colleges Rankings for the University of Tennessee - Knoxville and our peers.

The University of Tennessee - Knoxville

In the 2024 rankings, the University of Tennessee – Knoxville (UTK) rose to #105 in the national rankings and to #51 in the public school rankings. In the national rankings UTK is tied with nine other institutions and with six in the public ranking.

The university was listed in the Most Innovative Schools rankings for the first time at 58th nationally and 29th among public schools which was better than ten of our sixteen peers. UTK was also once again ranked in the Best Colleges for Veterans rankings at 71st nationally and 51st (down 1) among publics.

Our undergraduate business program ranked 38th nationally (up 1) and 25th among publics (up 1 place). The supply chain/logistics program is again highly ranked at 4th nationally (down 1) and is also still 3rd among public schools. Undergraduate engineering is ranked 61st (up 7 places) nationally and 34th among publics (up 4 places). Nursing came in at 67th (down 16 spots) nationally and 51st among publics (down 14 places). Computer Science ranked 71st nationally (up 1) and 38 among publics while Economics (53rd public) and Psychology (54th public) were ranked for the first time. These discipline rankings are based solely on the peer surveys of deans and senior faculty members of the different programs.


U.S. News made the following major changes in their methodology this year.

- Outcomes increased from 40% to 52% by slightly increasing some weights and adding First-Generation graduation rates and graduate earnings.
- Graduation rate performance is now based on a 4-year average (up from 2-year).
- Faculty Salary includes all full-time instructional faculty (regardless of tenure or rank).
- Faculty research is a new ranking based on 4 measures of faculty citations from Elsevier.
- Financial Resources now only uses 1 year of data (sourced from IPEDS, FY21).
- Metrics dropped: class size, high school class standing, number of faculty with terminal degree, alumni giving.

UTK dropped in the Outcomes rank, moving down from 171 to 202. The drop was most likely fueled by a decrease in our Social Mobility Rank (from 250 to 312) driven by the addition of first-generation graduation rates. We also had minor ranking decreases in Financial Resources (132 to 133) and Faculty Compensation (55 to 63).

The University had a significant increase in our Faculty Resource Rank, improving from 198 to 78. We also ranked higher in the new Faculty Research category (41) than all but one of our peers.

The following chart shows the changes in Public Ranking of our comparative and aspirational peers over a three year period, from 2022 to 2024. Over this period, 4 peers increased their rank and 11 peers decreased with 2 having no change.



Peer Comparisons

The University of Tennessee – Knoxville has two sets of comparison peers: Comparative (10) and Aspirational (6). In the following section, we list the schools that exhibited the largest increases or decreases in the different categories. The movement in the rankings are in our opinion mostly caused by the significant changes in methodology by US News.
